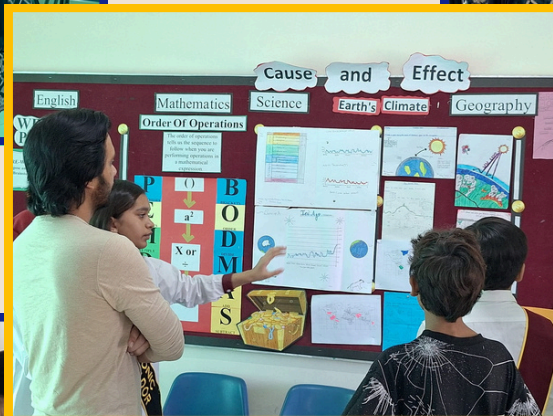




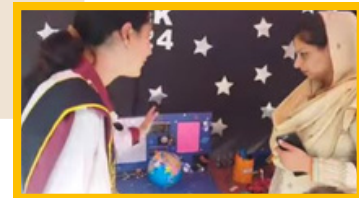
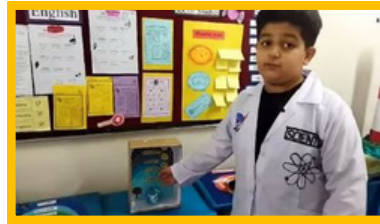

Theme 2: Sustainable Systems

In STEM Road Map , various standards are oriented towards system thinking, including ecosystems, the rock cycle, earth processes, Earth-Sun-Moon cycles, heat transfer, and interactions between different spheres (geosphere, biosphere, hydrosphere, atmosphere)



Grade 1 arranging the order of food from field to our tables.



Grade 7 studied the impact of pollution on aquatic ecosystems through an oil spill simulation activity and how bioaccumulation is higher in top predators through a bioaccumulation role-play activity



Habitat heroes of grade 3 searched about the animals in a specific habitat and how these animals help in making a sustainable system.



Grade 4 students made a mini eco model where they got to know how the plants and animals work together to make a sustainable ecosystem



Grade 4 made a setup of mini dam and investigated sustainable setups to opt to avoid floods.



Grade 5 students portrayed various animal species to illustrate interdependence within an ecosystem's food web. Through creative presentations, they highlighted the delicate balance required for ecosystems to thrive.



Students made drawings of biological specimens to understand how scientists in the early 17th century used their drawings to represent their findings



Grade 6 students created Venn diagrams to identify and differentiate between living and non-living things.



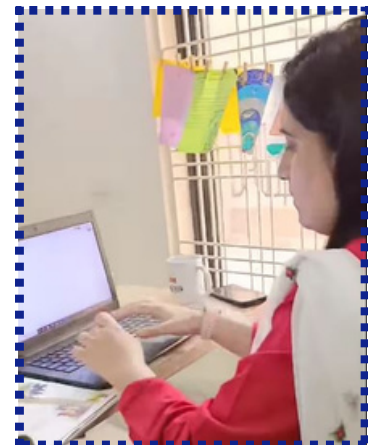
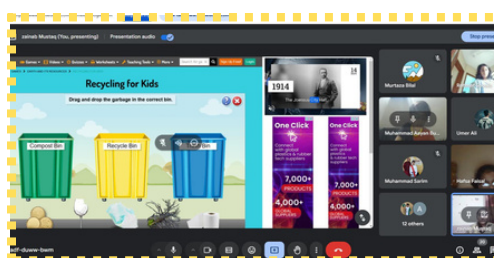
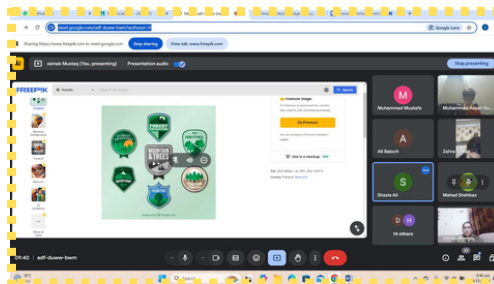
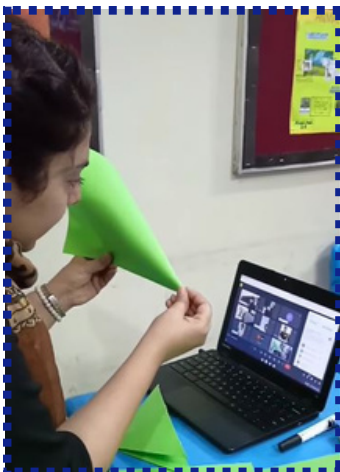
Grade 2 students learned about the importance of houses and how houses keep them safe.



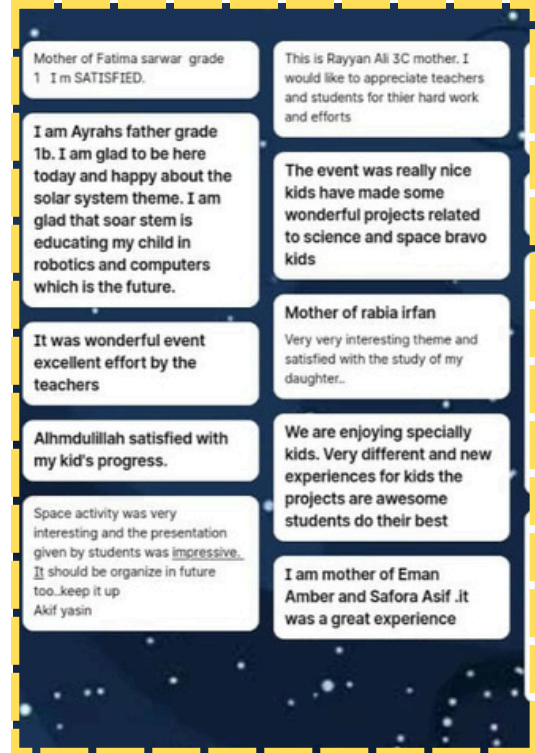
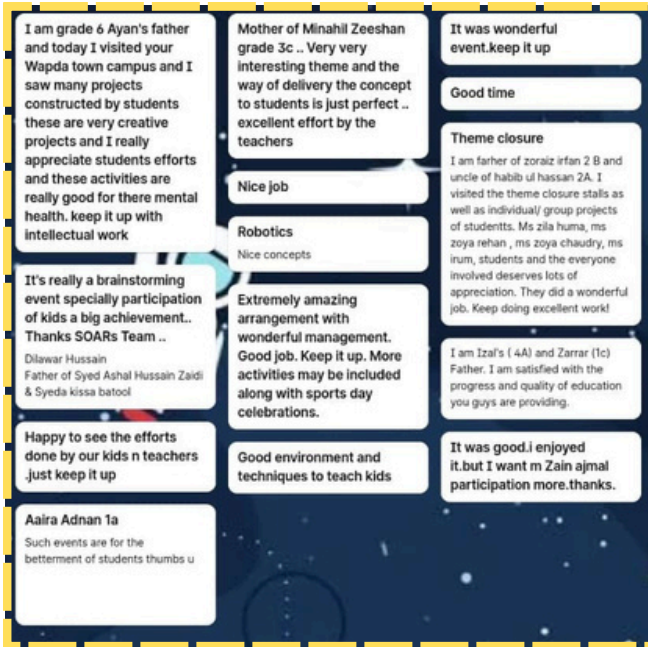
